## Aim

The project aims to develop the capacities of local actors to address environmental stability and climate resilience among communities vulnerable to food insecurity and environmental migration in 10 targeted kebeles within the Central Ethiopia Regional State. The project is designed to define the key outcomes of the project, which focus on “building local capacity of governmental and non-governmental partners to respond to identified and described risks associated with climate change and ecological stability, development of alternative agricultural practices and livelihoods, including eco-tourism among vulnerable community members; and specific support for landscape management”. And other technical interventions on sites primarily affected by degradation and geological hazards on the slopes of Hambaricho mountain.

## Activities

To accomplish the above-mentioned objectives, the project carried out a variety of activities during the reporting period, this year, including the green income generation activities support of women groups in the production of vegetables, climate-smart agriculture, sustainable land management and others.

## Outputs

The project has three outputs designed to contribute to the desired outcome of project implementation:

- 1 Risk assessment and capacity building
- 2 Climate resilient livelihoods and agriculture
- 3 Sustainable landscape management

## Target Area

The project is located in Kedida Gamela and Kacha Bira woredas, which are near Mount Hambaricho and are tackled by the main problems of water scarcity, drought, soil degradation, erosion, and landslides.
